## July Message from Board President Roger Irwin

As you have come in and out over the last week or two, I'm sure you noticed installers working around the outside of the Clubhouse and down around the pool. Your board decided that it was time we added some security to our facilities.

#### ADDING SAFETY AND SECURITY

Up to now, we have had no real way of knowing if non-members are trespassing on our grounds during off hours, or who damaged someone's car sometime during the day. Delivery trucks often hit the building, light poles, cars and other things, and we have no way of proving which driver did it. We not only incur property damage, our staff often leave well after dark when someone could easily hide and assault them as they make their way to their cars.

To provide a better sense of safety and security, we are installing 12 cameras strategically located around the Clubhouse to give us full views of all parking areas and

primary entrances into and out of the building. This will include one 360-degree camera in the bag room and one in the cart barn. Similarly, three cameras will be placed around the Sports Complex and the outbuildings housing our grounds equipment.

Please be assured that no cameras are being installed to view inside the Clubhouse, Heights Grill Patio or the Terrace. Additionally, no one will be monitoring camera views. The video will only be viewed in the event of an unresolvable issue of property damage or personnel safety. The monitors will be located upstairs in the accounting office near our server, well out of the way of everyone.



## **Greening Back Up and Tick Sightings**

After a cold, wet April into May, high pressure held over Montour Heights for a span of 20 days. We were short of the all-time record of 26 days with no rain, but things got seriously dry pretty quickly. Mid-May through early-June gave the new irrigation system a real workout, sending out over 6.6 million gallons in just over three weeks. With the lake on #15 down 10 feet, the Board of Directors authorized purchase of city water. Fortunately, rain has returned to the forecast, and things are greening back up. I'm hoping we've seen the last of water purchases for 2023.

We had no irrigation leaks or problems through that first dry spell. The new system has eliminated approximately 90% of the hand watering we normally did on our greens. Fairways continue to be an issue, mainly topographically due to fairway design and construction. Pete Dye signature fairway design slopes in toward the center. Gravity pulls water to the middle of the fairway with the edges and bumps drying out. Irrigation Tech Doug and Assistant Superintendent Jason are working to dial in individual heads to try to find the right balance.

Our temporary workers continue to settle into their new positions on the crew. Some of our Mexican crewmen have been with us for 18+ years, leaving some enormous shoes to fill. Accumulated experience is impossible to replace, and we're hoping to see them return in the fall.

There have been a lot of tick sightings reported by grounds crew and members over the past few weeks. Please be extra vigilant, especially when looking for balls in the tall grass. Most notably, deer ticks are quite small, and distinguish themselves from other insects with the four sets of legs. Lyme disease can be quite serious, but may be prevented by looking yourself over after golf or any other outdoor activity. If you are bitten, please seek prompt medical attention.

We need ONE boy, age 8 or younger. We have three fantastic swimmers and need a fourth. Who can learn to swim 25 meters by mid-July? Your teammates are sure to get you a nice-sized lead, too!

We need ONE boy, age 10 or younger. Likewise, we have three fantastic swimmers and need a fourth.

We need TWO boys, age 12 or younger. In this age group, the swimmers race 50 meters each. That's down and back.

On the girls events, the team has a nice number of 8-and-under swimmers. One of those girls can swim in the 10-and-under age group. Here, we have three already, but it would be better to have a swimmer age 9 or 10 for that relay, too.

Either way, we'll be able to field a team in that age group. We have two super-fast girls ages 11 and 12 who might be required to swim in the 17 and under age group. So, we could use a number of older girl swimmers to optimize the line-up.

A swimming relay requires FOUR athletes. Each swimmer does one leg, generally ONE length of the pool, only 25 meters. Regardless of your current abilities, Coach Mark can help you get both comfortable and speedy in the water in the days and weeks to come.

Attend a practice at 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday to get started, except on swim meet days.


